February 4

in 1986, a stamp of Sojourner Truth is issued by the U.S. Postal Service.

February 6

On this day in 1867, The Peabody Fund for Black education in the South established.

February 8

Figure skater Debi Thomas became the first African American to win the Women's Singles of the U.S. National Figure Skating Championship competition, was a pre-med student at Stanford University in 1986.

February 10

1964, After 10 days of debate and voting on 125 amendments, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the Civil Rights Act of 1964 by a vote of 290-130. The bill prohibited any state or local government or public facility from denying access to anyone because of race or ethnic origin. It further gave the U.S. Attorney General the power to bring school desegregation law suits.

February 13

The first Black professional basketball team "The Renaissance" organized 1923.

February 15

Spinks defeated Muhammad Ali for heavyweight boxing championship.

February 16

Joe Frazier knocked out Jimmy Ellis in the second round of their New York fight and became the world heavy-weight boxing champion in 1970.

February 18

in 1913, the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority was incorporated at Howard University.

February 19

Vonetta Flowers became the first black gold medalist in the history of the Winter Olympic Games.

February 20 - Death of Frederick Douglass (78), Douglass was the leading Black spokesman for almost fifty years. He was a major abolitionist and a lecturer and editor. Charles Wade Barkley, basketball player, born Leeds, AL, February 20, 1963.

February 22

DJ Jazzy Jeff and the Fresh Prince won the first rap Grammy for the hit single "Parents Just Don't Understand."

February 25

Muhammad Ali defeated Sonny Liston for world heavyweight boxing championship in 1964.

Boxer Mike Tyson becomes the undisputed Heavyweight Champion of the World by defeating challenger Frank Bruno of England in 1989.

February 27

Figure skater Debi Thomas becomes the first African American to win a medal (bronze) at the winter Olympic Games in 1988.

February 28

Musician and entertainer Michael Jackson wins eight Grammy Awards. His album, "Thriller",broke all sales records to-date, and remains one of the top-grossing albums of all time




